I was decided to hear you found my photo. I had been wondering what had become of them. I'd love to see them. - I was glad you told me what sort of things they were that were stored away at Auntie's place. I had no idea they were. - What do you mean, when you say the dates are having to lay there without being used? Are the other things being used then? Anyway, I hope our dear mother will be able to use everything herself now. - We too are watching the lists that are being published here, and beat on hoping for the best. God will help -

I was glad to hear you liked the picture - post-cards I sent you from Bournemouth. It really is very nice there and I had a lovely time. I stayed a week and that being an annual holiday was paid by my firm as if I had been working. Which is about £30.00 after taxes etc have been deducted. Not enough for a week's holiday, but the price is almost that much alone. But in months saving up for it. - I will leave you early. I come to the 20th week from an other week holiday which I managed to get, without pay, mind you, but it had not ~~been~~ <sup>been</sup> ~~retreated~~ <sup>retreated</sup> ~~and~~ <sup>and</sup> ~~costed~~ <sup>costed</sup> almost as much as I needed while on holiday.

You see, I need to a passport for visiting - why, which are not up, in a number of places all over England and Wales in co-operation with the British war-organisation - committee. For people (in that case Spanish people) that would like a holiday on the land and at the same time be postive and help in with the war effort, at different forms, have being a certificate of labour, thereby also earning some money. - For the first time in my

life I actually worked on the land. - I must say! none of it really is hard work. In the whole I enjoyed it very much. - We were a jolly crowd. - Boys & girls from all over the country. Some people from the regular Board - Kibbutzim here when in charge; and for the week-end we lived quite a number of visitors from the Kibbutzim. -

Friday 6/9 I'm going to London to Sam's place. Will take the phone together 3/2. I haven't seen them for some time; & I am looking forward to the evening speak - and of course I'll take your letter with me, and see them again to write. - Please send your next letter to Sam's address. I'm having the move out here very good don't know when to, yet. It is rather difficult. - I'd like to move to London now, as near as I get my release, but I should not be very long. But it is very difficult to find lodgings there, at the moment. Jobs are not so scarce. - I do hope you can read all that, the paper really is awful (my writing too). Well!
