Although I have not written, I have always been thinking of you, and reading your very welcome letters. I was glad to hear that you are studying for your matriculation, and I wish you the best of luck for the exam.

At the moment I am on holiday from school-I think that I have told you before that I go to a secondary school for girls. It is a very nice school, with accommodations for many kinds of sports. We have a swimming pool and tennis courts, and a few fields for hockey and netball-(the latter two games are played a lot in England and especially in schools). As you see we do a lot of sports in school-but I do not want you to think that this is all we do. We have some very good teachers, and on the whole we get along quite well. I have private Hebrew lessons twice a week. I learn Mishnah with Rabbi's commentary, and Shulchan Aruch.

For my holiday I went to Cambridge for a week. I am sure that you have heard of Cambridge the very famous university town of England. I stayed there for one week, and had a good look at the different colleges. I am going to stay with Sara this week-end in London. Our little niece is indeed very sweet, and I am looking forward to seeing her very much. I wish you could see her-I'll try to send you a photograph of her.
