Dear Z in Eng'.

The last letter we received from Men was dated the beginning of March. I hope you have written since. I was very pleased to hear, that you are keeping well, and that you like it there. — Also we keep on writing through the Red + the Jugos basis, to our dear mothers. I am sorry to say we haven't heard anything for months. This should help we should all be able to be together soon. I am very worried at times, but worrying about a thing does not help, we must pray to H., and have faith in him, and hope that everything will turn out for the best. — You were complaining in your last letters about me not working enough about myself. Well, there is not much really. I suppose you know that my occupation is being a manageress in one of the Grodzinski shops. I earn £3 a week. I am living in Letchworth and having to travel up to London every day my fare-money amounts to rather a lot. I also pay towards the household, but still we must be satisfied, and so I am. In the house I manage nicely. There is always a lot to do in my spare time. I read quite a lot. Sundays or sometimes in the evening I go out with my friends or with Sare and Chaim, or Tully to the picture or to see a good play, or listen to a concert. Now that the days are getting warmer towards summer, I'll probably go swimming and play tennis. — Last week I took a day off during the week and went

to the shopping - centre of London the West - End.
(Oxford - Street, Piccadilly Circus &c. &c.). I had to
get a number of things for myself, and afterwards
I went to see Tully, to the place where he works.
I had never been there before, being right ~~on~~ in the
other side of London, too much a distance.
Anyway I had not seen him for some time, so
I thought I might as well pop up there. He works
in a big building right opposite the Diamond -
but where Onkel Herschel and Onkel Bert are
spending ~~their~~ time all day. He was surprised
to see me, I talked to him for about 1 hour. He
happened to be very busy. He is cutting diamond
in his own now, and he will be making quite a
lot of money soon. He likes his work and that
is the main thing. I gave him your last letters
and he said he will write to you soon. I
will speak to him on the phone soon and
I'll ask him whether he has done so. - Sara and
Mein are getting on very well, thank God
they are very happy. I guess Sara needs to
you stand herself all the time no work. Any -
way they live in a nice flat near mine Charn
works. Sometimes I come there and stay
over night. That's about $\frac{1}{2}$ of an hour from where I work.

In Getdwert everybody is all right. I live together
with Tante Sara, Onkel Herschel, Leo, Gigi, Judith and
Peter. Peter, Boris and the children live about 20 min.

walk from us, and the Goodincki Family lives
opposite them. Through the war a lot of people
are evacuated to Litchfield, most of them goes
as a matter of fact it is supposed to be the
most orthodox community amongst all the other
places where people went to because of the bombs
being been in London. Broek comes to see us
once a week, he is getting on all right with his
new job. Estes has a lot to learn in school,
and does not get much spare time. She is getting up
in very well and sends her regards to you and
to all the other relations. Please write
more next time, about yourself and the other
dear ones. - It is very late now I have to stop,
otherwise I won't be able to get up to-morrow, to
catch my train. Forgive me for my writing, I hope
you will be able to read it, as you can see
I am in a hurry.
