My dear you & Mrs

It is a long time since I wrote to you last, although I promised to write more often. I read all the letters you write to Fay's and we are very pleased to hear that you are well and getting on with your study. Many thanks for the letter you have sent to my address, it arrived just on 10.0. We are here together here in my flat and lead a really nice life. I hope you and family. Please give her my love. The letter you wrote in general really astonished me, so very nice it was. I thought to suppose that you have your own funds for the way you make it just sounded like it.

Whether is living with us now she wrote for you this and I think she has told all about her, herself.

I was. She can say and understand everything now and is really amusing. She looks very much like Elaine and has his nature too. She seems to be very friendly and can amuse herself with paper and pencil for hours. Good how a last way dear Elaine's. He is engaged on post-war building research work since last summer. Elaine is studying Architecture now, at the Royal Polytechnic London. It is a very interesting study. He does that in his spare time. That is I remember every week after 8 o'clock. He is working for his R.I.B.A. (Royal Institution of British Architects) diploma. I am very interested in the work - mostly in design - this study is really a continuation of his previous study in Science.

I have just heard the depressing news over the radio announcing the sudden death of Princess Margaret. I suppose our nation has suffered a great loss. Otherwise the war news is good. I hope by the time this letter will reach you this war will have come to an end. And we may

have some good news from out dearest Mother's

once more all unite in Palestine. But our mission  
is to settle in Palestine.

Please write to me about life in Palestine. You  
being in London. Write to me direct otherwise  
there is normally some delay until I get your  
letter except now that Father is here too.

How dear Mother's I am looking forward  
to your next letter they are really worth reading.  
Peri usually advises them, he remarks:  
"I did not know that Mother had so  
much in him". He thinks a lot of you, and  
me all. (Wouldn't it be strange if not?)
